

In Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 (to date), the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) has awarded **more than \$3.2 million to Howard University College of Medicine in Washington, District of Columbia** to support the health workforce and other programs, including:

- Over \$1.6 million to support training and diversifying the health workforce including through the Centers of Excellence program that provides educational and training opportunities focused on increasing racial and ethnic diversity among health professions as well as training grants to grow the dental workforce;
- Nearly \$1 million to expand the number of fellows trained as addiction medicine specialists working in underserved and rural communities; and,
- Over \$680,000 to support primary health care and support services in outpatient settings for people with HIV.
